

RABBI M. S. LAZARON TO WED

**His Bride Will Be Miss Horkheimer,
Of Wheeling, W. Va.**

The Rev. Morris S. Lazaron, who succeeded the late Dr. Adolf Guttmacher as rabbi of the Baltimore Hebrew Congregation last summer, has announced his engagement to Miss Pauline Horkheimer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Horkheimer, of Wheeling, W. Va., the city in which was Mr. Lazaron's last charge.

Mr. Lazaron is the youngest rabbi in the city, in spite of the fact that he has charge of the largest Hebrew congregation. He is 27 years old and has been out of college a little more than a year. He has made a deep impression upon the members of his flock since his arrival here by his earnestness in his work and his forceful preaching. The announcement of his engagement has stirred wide interest among his new friends.

The romance of Mr. Lazaron and his fiancée started in Wheeling, Miss Horkheimer and her parents being members of his congregation there. The bride-to-be has a wide circle of acquaintances and a number of friends in this city, where she attended college for two years and where she made her debut two years ago at the Harmony Circle ball. She is the niece of Mrs. Estelle Horkheimer, 2341 Eutaw Place; of Mrs. Charles Gans, 2222 Eutaw Place, and of Mr. and Mrs. Nathan Miller, formerly of Baltimore, but now of New York. She is an extremely pretty young woman and talented, having won a degree at Barnard College, where she completed her education after leaving Goucher College.

No definite date has been set for the wedding, which probably will take place some time next June.
