Sheweth

That he is a native of Hamblugh in
Germany.

That he is a son of Daniel Joseph Cliffe
now residing at Holywood aforesaid who came over to this County
in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty three
and has ever since resided here and carried on business as a
Merchant.

That the said Daniel Joseph Cliffe -
obtained his Certificate of naturalization on the twentieth of
October one thousand eight hundred and fifty six and having
afterwards taken the oath prescribed by 7th & 8th Vic. cap. 66. last
the said Certificate was on the sixth of November one thousand
eight hundred and fifty six enrolled in the Office of the Recorder of the
Majesty's High Court of Chancery in Ireland on the said sixth
of November one thousand eight hundred and fifty six.

That the said Daniel Joseph Cliffe
carries on business as a Merchant in London in Ireland and in
Belfast in Ireland and that your Memorialist has always resided
with his said Father and has for the last three years been joint
as a partner with his said Father in carrying on his said business
at Belfast aforesaid.

That your Memorialist is twenty four
years of age, is unmarried, and intends to continue to reside per-
manently within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland
and

and to continue to carry on business as a Merchant in respect
aforesaid and in order to enable him to do so he seeks to assert
the rights and capacities of a natural born British Subject. -

That Memorialist begs leave to refer to
the declarations accompanying this Memorial and verifying the
statements hereinbefore contained. -

Your Memorialist therefore begs

That in pursuance of the power and
authority given to you as one of Her
Majesty's Secretaries of State you will
be pleased to grant unto your Memorialist
a Certificate conferring upon him, on
his taking the Oath prescribed by
the Statute in that behalf made and
provided, the rights and capacities of
a natural born British Subject. -

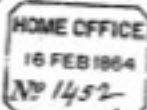

Declare that the several statements contained in the Memorial
to the Right Honourable Sir George Grey Bart bearing date the
11th day of February 1864, which I have signed as the Memoran-
dum and on which I have endorsed my initials at the time of making
this Declaration are correct and true to the best of my knowledge,
information and belief. And I make the above solemn declaration
conscientiously believing the same to be true and by virtue of
the provisions of an Act made and passed in the 5th and 6th
year of the reign of His Majesty King William the 4th for the
suppression of Voluntary and Ecclesiastical Oaths and oaths
declarations in law thereof.

Belfast, this 11th day of February 1864
