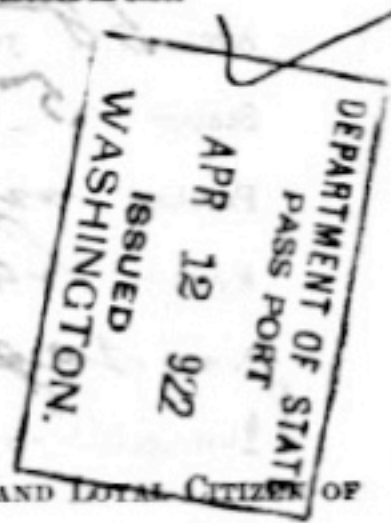

The original and each copy of an application for a passport must have attached to it a copy of the applicant's photograph. A loose signed photograph of the applicant must accompany the application. The photographs must be on thin paper, should have a light background, and be not over three inches in size.

This blank must be completely filled out. The legal fee of one dollar, in currency or postal money order, and the applicant's certificate of naturalization must accompany the application. The rules should be carefully read before mailing the application to the Department of State, Division of Passport Control, Washington, D. C.

I, Carl Eichenberg, a NATURALIZED AND LOYAL CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, hereby apply to the Department of State, at Washington, for a passport.

I solemnly swear that I was born at Adelebsen, in Germany on January 18th, 1864; that my father, A. L. Eichenberg, was born in same place and is dead that I emigrated to the United States, sailing from Hamburg, by about Sept. 4th, 1887; that I resided 34 1/2 years, uninterruptedly, in the United States, from 1894 to 1922 at Galveston, Tex.; that I was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the County Court of Galveston Tex at Galveston, Texas, on Jan. 23rd, 1913, as shown by the Certificate of Naturalization presented herewith; that I am the IDENTICAL PERSON described in said Certificate; that I have resided outside the United States since my naturalization at the following places for the following periods:

several times, from 4-15 months in Stettin and Copenhagen Denmark during the late war and that I am domiciled in the United States, my permanent residence being at Galveston in the State of Texas, where I follow the occupation of exporter of advanced products. My last passport was obtained from Department of State U.S.A. on June 3rd, 1919 and was cancelled on return. I am about to go abroad temporarily, and intend to return to the United States within six months with the purpose of residing and performing the duties of citizenship therein; and I desire a passport for use in visiting the countries hereinafter named for the following purpose:
