I, Hedwig Luise Eichenberg, a NATURALIZED AND LOYAL CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES, hereby apply to the Department of State, at Washington, for a passport.

I solemnly swear that I was born at Hamburg, Germany on or about the 27 day of October, 1900; that my father Carl Eichenberg was born in Germany that he emigrated to the United States, sailing on board the S.S. Hammonia from Hamburg on or about September 4, 1887; that he resided 36 years, uninterruptedly, in the United States, from 1887 to 1923 at New Orleans, Port Arthur, Dallas, Galveston, Texas; that he was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the County Court of Galveston at Galveston, on January 23, 1903 as shown by the accompanying Certificate of Naturalization; that I am the daughter of the person described in said Certificate; that I have resided in the United States, uninterruptedly, for 22 years, from 1901 to 1923, at Galveston, Port Arthur, Dallas, Texas; that I am domiciled in the United States, my permanent residence being at Galveston, in the State of Texas, where I follow the occupation of medical student. My last passport was obtained from Washington in 1916 and was on return to New York taken up and cancelled by U.S. authorities I am about to go abroad temporarily; and intend to return to the United States within 12 months with the purpose of residing and performing the duties of citizenship therein; and that I desire a passport for use in visiting the countries hereinafter named for the following purpose:

- Mexico, Germany, Holland
- Belgium, Denmark
- Norway, Sweden, England

I intend to leave the United States from the port of Galveston probably sailing on board the S.S. Nord-Friesland on or about June 8, 1923
