[See original](#) 724. BENJAMIN BARNES was indicted for stealing, on the 9th of March, a jacket, value 7 s. , the goods of Solomon Davis .

SAMUEL GILES . I am a patrol. On the 9th of March, between of twelve and one o'clock in the day-time, I was in Whitechapel; and saw the prisoner running with something under his jacket. I stopped him, and asked what he had there - he said a jacket which he had

bought in Shoreditch. I asked him to shew me where, he said he would not, and I took into custody.

EPHRAIM ASCOLI . I am shopman to Solomon Davis , tailor, Osborne-street, Whitechapel. This jacket hung out of doors for sale; I was told a man had taken it, ran out, but could see nobody.

GUILTY .
