A total of 4227 Jews reached Theresienstadt in 14 transports – including 3 single transports – and, according to one Theresienstadt statistic, 841 survived. In the later stages of the war, the transports from Frankfurt too were used for various groups of Jews from elsewhere, as for example, from Wiesbaden, Darmstadt and Koblenz and even from Cologne, Düsseldorf, Halle (Saale) and Leipzig. This first mass transport out of Frankfurt-on-the-Main with elderly Jews departed on Tuesday, 18th August 1942 for Theresienstadt under the number "Da 503". This was the seventh deportation train to leave this city. It contained mainly the residents of several Jewish old-age homes and the Jewish Hospital on Gagern Street. The old-age home on Rechneigraben Street behind the Cathedral, and a detention center on the Hermesweg served as assembly camps. On arrival at Theresienstadt the transport was designated "XII/1". As early as September and October 1942, 286 persons from this transport were sent on to Treblinka. At the beginning of 1943, nine of its deportees were transferred to Auschwitz and during 1944, another 48 persons. Of the whole transport, only 17 participants survived the persecution.
