On the 30th August 1942, or in the early morning of Monday the 31st August 1942, the second special train to leave Breslau Odertor Station, departed for Theresienstadt with 1065 elderly Jews on board, drawn from the Breslau and Liegnitz regions of Middle and Lower Silesia. The special train, Nr. "Ad 508" arrived in Theresienstadt as the eighth transport of the "Schedule Group" (Fahrplanstaffel), newly introduced since 13th August 1942, and was there registered with the number "IX/2".

This train, by way of example, brought to Bohemia the 81 year old Flora Lasker (1861-1942). She was the grandmother and last family member of Renate Lasker (b. 1924) and Anita Lasker (b. 1925) of Breslau. Both their parents, Alfons and Edith Lasker had already been carried off from the native city Breslau to Izbica, in the Lublin area, with the transport of 13th August 1942, but without their daughters, since at that time both these were over the age of 16. The grandmother of the young women soon died in the Bohemian ghetto, on the 9th September 1942. In September and October 1942 292 persons (as far as is known today) were transferred to Auschwitz. Early in 1943, 26 Breslauers from this transport, and another 107 during 1944, arrived in Auschwitz. Out of the transport from Breslau of the 30/31st August, only 30 lived to see the end of the War.
