In 12 transports – among them 4 transportations of individuals – a total of 2,816 Jews from Silesia reached Theresienstadt; only 198 of them survived the persecution. The departure date of the present transport is uncertain, with the 25th or the 26th seeming more probable. Besides Jews from Breslau, people coming from the following Silesian towns were part of the transport: Bad Aldheide, Beuthen, Brieg, Bunzlau, Fraustadt, Freiburg (Silesia), Glogau, Grünberg, and Hirschberg in the Riesengebirge. Konstadt, Landeshut, Liegnitz, Münsterberg, Oels, Reichenbach in the Eulengebirge, Schweidnitz, Waldenburg, Bad Warmbrunn and Wiesenau. The train designation on arrival in Theresienstadt was "IX/1". Already in September and October, 400 persons from this transport were transferred to Treblinka. In January 1943, eight people were deported 8 persons to Auschwitz, and during 1944 a further 49 followed them. Out of the whole transport, only 23 persons survived.
