A total of 1,126 Jews from the area controlled by the Dortmund Gestapo HQ were deported to Theresienstadt in 10 transports – among them 5 transportations of individuals. This transport from the District of Arnsberg had the State Railways number "Da 72" and in Theresienstadt was assigned the designation "X/1". The assembly point in Dortmund was the bar "Zur Börse".

Besides 327 to 350 Dortmund Jews, this transport included additional Jews from Anröchte, Beringhausen, Bochum, Brilon, Castrop-Rauxel, Ergste, Erwitte, Hagen, Hamm, Hattingen, Hemer, Herbede, Herne, Isserlohn, Lippstadt, Lünen, Neheim, Plettenberg, Röddenau, Siegen, Soest, Unna, Wanne-Eickel, Wattenscheid and Witten. Besides, this transport also carried off Luxemburg Jews, including several who had previously emigrated to Luxemburg from the Dortmund region.

As early as August 1942, 3 persons from this transport were moved on to Maly Trostinec near Minsk. In September and October 1942, 219 persons were transferred to Treblinka, near Warsaw. In January 1943, 97 Dortmund Jews reached Auschwitz, and in the course of 1944, a further 199 were taken there in transports. 90 Persons survived persecution.
