With this transport, which was registered as "I/96" in Theresienstadt, the Jewish Hospital on Iranischestrasse 2-4 in the Borough of Wedding was cleared of "bed-ridden patients". However, the institution continued to serve as a prison, a shelter for children, a hospital and, in addition, as the new seat of the State Union of the Jews in Germany ("Reichsvereinigung der Juden in Deutschland"). Included in this transport were the last "full Jews" of the Berlin Jewish Community, which, according to the Gestapo declaration of 10<sup>th</sup> June 1943, had ceased to exist. Among these were the couple Hildegard and Moritz Henschel and Martha Mosse. The attorney Dr. Moritz Henschel (1879-1947), having succeeded Heinrich Stahl to the office in 1940, was the last President of the Berlin Jewish Community, where his wife worked in the administration of health-care. Both survived Theresienstadt and immigrated to Palestine in 1946. A former administrative lawyer in the Berlin Police HQ, Martha Mosse (1884-1977) directed the advisory office for housing at the State Union of the Jews in Germany. She survived, and after the war, reentered the service of the Berlin judiciary. 81 People (of this transport) survived the war.
