In the words of Hildegard Henschel, the transport with train no. "Da 514" included "the entire Iranischestrasse Old Age Home, the Weissensee Home for Deaf-mutes and Blind as well as hundreds of individuals", who were deported from the Freight Station Berlin-Moabit (Pulitz Street) to the Bohemian Transitghetto. On arrival in Theresienstadt, they were registered under the transport designation "I/65". An erroneous date (3<sup>rd</sup> September 1942) is recorded for the transport by Hildegard Henschel. Of this transport, 42 persons were deported on to Treblinka as soon as September and October 1942. Eighteen transportees in January 1943 and another 97 during 1944 reached Auschwitz; there were 57 survivors.
