Particularly extensive, the "26th Transport to the East" from Berlin was carried out immediately after the traffic closure was lifted. It included 74 persons of all ages from the Jewish Hospital at 17, Auguststrasse in Berlin. There were other elderly Berliners who had not been taken on the Theresienstadt transports, such as, for example, the 65 year old writer Else Ury (1877-1943), authoress of the popular "Nesthäckchen Books" for girls, who reached Auschwitz with this transport. The arrival of some 1000 people was registered there. After a "selection", only 127 men were admitted to the camp as detainees, while the others were killed in the "old" gas chambers at Birkenau.
