To the eighth major transport from the Reich after the "Factory Action" we assign the identifier "VIII". The fifth transport after the "Factory Action" in Berlin was simultaneously the "35th Transport to the East" out of that city. Additionally on this transport, 25 persons in preventive detention, all born between 1902 and 1905, were being sent to Auschwitz concentration camp, to be brought to Monowitz for forced labor. They were partners in mixed marriages who were presumably being punished after their arrest for resistance during the "Factory Action". Already two weeks later they were sent back from the Monowitz sub-camp to Berlin and were subsequently employed in track-laying work at the Grossbeeren labor camp.

For the 7th March 1943, Danuta Czech noted the arrival of a transport carrying 665 Jews (183 men and 482 women) from Berlin. After the "selection" undergone by the transport, only 153 men and 65 women were accepted in the camp as prisoners and the remaining 447 people (30 men and 417 women) were killed shortly after in the gas chambers in the Birkenau camp.
