On the 30<sup>th</sup> October, the last "Autumn Transport" from Theresienstadt, designated "Ev", arrived in Birkenau. It comprised 949 men and boys as well as 1089 women and girls. Out of this transport we know 169 survivors. In the words of Miroslav Kary, " it was the last of all the transports which, on arrival in Auschwitz, were separated into potential laborers and 'useless eaters'. This last selection had the usual consequences: 217 men and 132 women were absorbed in the camps; 1689 men, women and children met their death on the 30<sup>th</sup> October 1944 in the gas-chamber. The transport which arrived four days later from Sered' was absorbed into the camp without selection." The Prague transport "Eu" from Bohemia, was carried out jointly with the Theresienstadt transport "Ev". It consisted of 18 persons, including the last employees of the Prague Jewish Community.

Summarizing, we may state that, in the course of the two years between October 1942 and October 1944, over 46,750 human beings were deported from Theresienstadt to the Upper Silesian extermination camp at Auschwitz. When the transports from Bohemia to Auschwitz ended, "only" 11,077 persons remained in Theresienstadt. However, up to that point in time, more than 130,000 people had been transported into the Bohemian Ghetto and almost 30,000 had died within its walls, of old age, starvation, grief and violence.
