This transport left Saxony a day after the "Wannsee Conference" in Berlin, the proceedings of which no longer had any immediate effect on the deportations to Riga. By the 20th January 1942, 563 Leipzig Jews had to report at an assembly camp in the 32nd Elementary School, Yorckstrasse 32 (today: Erich-Weinertstrasse). The excuse given for the transport was of labor required in the East. The passenger train prepared for the purpose took aboard, in Dresden, a considerable further number of Jews coming from other Saxonian towns, among them 240 to 250 from Dresden, of whom 207 are so far known by name. The deportees' average age was 42; among them were 56 children up to the age of 10. Only 47 persons of the transport survived. On the 21st January 1942 (BS- surely not 1941!) some 150 Jews were deported from Braunschweig and its environs, and were presumably attached to this transport via Leipzig and not to the following transport from Berlin.
