This deportation was designated as "Ax" in Theresienstadt. Earlier the destination of this transport had been assumed to be Osowa and Sobibor. Meantime, it may be possible to differentiate between Lublin-Majdanek, Sobibor, Osowa and Siedliszcze for various groups of deportees on the train. First, in Lublin, they were subjected to a "selection" on a side track. Then 200 to 220 men aged 15 to 50 were chosen from the transport and accommodated in Majdanek, as shown by later entries in the camp's death register for prisoners.

The remaining 780 to 800 people were brought via Kanie Station to the village of Siedliszcze (Chelm District). Already on the 18th May 1942, one half of their number, together with the local Jews, were deported to Sobibor and killed there. From the other half of this group, which was hauled to Sobibor extermination camp on October 22nd 1942, a few men and women were still assigned to water works construction in Osowa labor camp – as attested by survivors. The township Siedliszcze-on-Cholm and the village of Osawa in the Lublin district were located only a few kilometers from Sobibor.
