STREET, Jessie Mary Grey, B.A. (Mrs), wife of Chief Justice, N.S.W.; dau. of C. A. G. Lillingston, Yulgilbar, Clarence River, N.S.W.; b. 1889, Chota Nagpur, India; came to Aust. when seven years of age; ed. Wycombe Abbey Schs., Eng., and Univ. of Syd.; took part in Conf. of Internatl. Cl. of Women in Rome 1911; foundn. memb. League of Nations Union, Syd., 1918; attended League of Nations, Geneva, 1930, 1938; 1st Pres. United Assns. of Women 1928, again 1943; Chrmn. Russian Medical Aid and Comforts Cttee., N.S.W., 1941-45; memb. of A.L.P. 1939; contested Wentworth seat in Fedl. Elections 1943 as endorsed Labour candidate, was narrowly defeated; first Chrmn. Aust. Women's Charter Cttee. 1943; memb. Aust. Deleg. to United Nations Conf. at San Francisco 1945; Pres. Aust. Russian Socy. 1946; memb. Economic and Social Cl. (formerly Chief Justice of N.S.W.); b. Jan. 28, 1890, Syd.; ed. Syd. Gram. Sch. and Univ. of Syd., G. and M. Harris Scholar, Wigram Allen Scholar, Pitt Cobbett Prize; called to Bar N.S.W. Mar. 1915; Lecturer Univ. of Syd. Law

Sch., Legal Interpretation 1921-22, Contracts, Mercantile Law and Torts 1923-25, Legal Ethics 1926-27; apptd. memb. Industrial Commssn. N.S.W. Dec. 18, 1927, with the rank and title of a Supreme Court Judge; a Judge of the Supreme Court of N.S.W. since Oct. 7, 1931 (believed to be the only instance in British Empire where father and son have sat as members of the same Bench at the same time); commissioned Duke of Cornwall's Light Inf. 1914, discharged as unfit active service, home service Aust. 1915-19, German Concentration Camp, Holdsworthy, N.S.W., District H.Q. Judge Aug. 1937, youngest judge to be apptd. to Vic. County Court Bench; Royal Commr. on Bush Fires, Vic., 1939, and on Forest Grazing 1946; sometime Pres.
